Mr. Sunley being a leading man in the Town and known for years past as one of its most prosperous tradesmen, justifies a notice of his life in the columns. His father was a native of the Riding of Yorkshire, England where he followed the employment of shoemaking, and immigrated to this Province in the year 1821 bringing with him a family of six sons and two daughters, Mr. Sunley Sen., dwelt about four years on Dundas Street, and afterwards removed, in the year 1835 to the neighboring Township of Eramosa, dying a few years since, at a good old age, in fair repute amongst his neighbours as a man and an Agriculturist. The subject of our notice, was his third son and being born in the year 1815, was 42 years old at the time of his death. Whilst his father lived on Dundas Street, he worked in Toronto as a tinsmith, where he was well known for his radical sympathies and opinions.
